

An Introduction

What Is It?

EMLS is a consortium of public bodies whose primary purpose is to procure legal services from specialist firms (see; "Who are the Partner Firms") at discounted rates through a framework contract. The current contact runs from 1 April 2018 to 31 March 2022.

Who Is In It?

Launched in 2006 with thirteen members, EMLS is now the largest such consortium in the country with over 150 members, as at October 2018.

Originally based in the east midlands, EMLS now has a membership that stretches from Durham in the north to Plymouth in the south, Herefordshire in the west to Suffolk in the east.

Most of its members are local authorities; county, unitary & district. However, the membership also includes fire & rescue authorities, universities, national parks, NHS trusts and town and parish councils.

Who Can Join?

Any local authority in England & Wales can join EMLS & we will also consider applications from other public bodies (See; "How You Can Join")

How It Works

Nottinghamshire County Council are the lead authority for the consortium and enters into a framework agreement with each of the partner firms. Each member must, on joining, sign a memorandum of understanding with Nottinghamshire.

After joining any authorised officer from a member organisation can then directly approach & instruct any of the partner firms or hold a mini competition with all or some of them. More advice on how to do so is in the "Welcome to EMLS" document which you can request from the EMLS Co-Ordinator Stuart Leslie (see page 12).

What Are The Benefits?

In practice they include every major area of law dealt with by local authorities except child care.


The Partner Firms

Who Runs It?

All the major decisions regarding the consortium are taken by this management board who are, except for the Chair, Jayne Francis -Ward and Cordinator, Stuart Leslie, all drawn from member organisations. Board members also sit, with partner firm representatives, on several specialist groups dealing with such issues as the website, annual training programme and biennial conference.

How To Join

Joining EMLS is straightforward. There is a standard request form on our website under the title "Join Us". Alternatively, you can send an email request to the EMLS Co-ordinator, Stuart Leslie, with a request to join. This must come from the chief legal officer, or equivalent, and include the names, titles & email addresses of those officers who are authorised to give instructions to the partner firms. If and when you are notified that your request has been accepted you will be sent a memorandum of understanding with Nottinghamshire County Council to sign and return (see "How it Works")

All authorised officers will be sent details on how to register onto the website which will enable them to see, amongst other things:

- details of each partner firm including their lead contact.
- the fixed hourly rates charged by each firm
- training material

Each authorised officer will also be sent the EMLS training programme for that year.
